Students on placement with the Equity, Diversity, and Inclusion (EDI) Team will be able to work on and support a range of enterprise-wide, strategically focused projects.

1. Equity, Diversity and Inclusion Strategy and Framework

The EDI Strategy and Framework will establish the vision, strategic priorities, and success measures for advancing equity, diversity, and inclusion (EDI) at La Trobe. It aims to enhance inclusivity, capability, and reputation while contributing to the university's overall success by fostering an equitable learning and working environment.

Students may be involved in supporting a communication and launch plan for the project or implementation planning.

2. Implementation of La Trobe's refreshed Equity, Diversity and Inclusion Governance Structure

La Trobe's EDI Governance Structure comprises an overarching committee of senior leaders, student representatives and advisory group chairs. It also consists of four advisory groups: including gender equity, cultural and linguistic diversity, LGBTQIA+ inclusion and disability advisory groups. The Equity, Diversity, and Inclusion Committee recently accepted recommendations to improve La Trobe's EDI governance structure. This involves strengthening the terms of reference for both the committee and the four advisory groups and setting up staff networks, such as a Pride Network for staff.

Students may be involved in supporting the establishment of staff networks or in setting up communication pathways to staff to uplift the visibility of EDI programs of work.

3. Refresh of intranet layout and pages

The EDI Team is currently refreshing the layout and pages for the intranet pages we are responsible for. To ensure that staff are able to find the information or support they need, we are changing the layout and content of the pages.

After training, students may be involved in developing a small project plan and timelines, reviewing and updating page content.
