Key Duties and Responsibilities

The student will be assisting the Restoration Field Officer by completing a literature review to develop a deeper understanding of Quandong Trees and how to increase their survivability in revegetation projects. Student will help Bush Heritage Australia fill a knowledge gap and the student will be contributing to tangible conservation. This project will focus on the following key components:

• Researching and compiling key data which will include literature reviews and finding resources by reaching out to Quandong enthusiast groups. The student will then deliver the findings to the team at the conclusion of their placement.

• Attending meetings with Monique. Initially to discuss her work and findings, catch up on the student's progress and resolve barriers.

•Attending regular meetings with Alysha to discuss the student's meet personal goals and learning objectives. and potentially visiting the Melbourne office.

• Learning about the not-for-profit sector.

• Opportunity to attend 'all staff' meetings and 'science call-ins'.
